The photo itself must not be provocative, vulgar, or offensive in nature

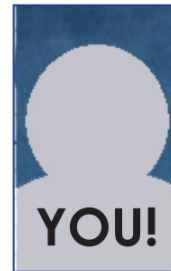
NO selfies
